The Bachelor of Community Education has eight units that all students study. These cover areas such as human learning and development, ethics, change theory, how to investigate individual and community needs and concludes with a year long field project of your choice.

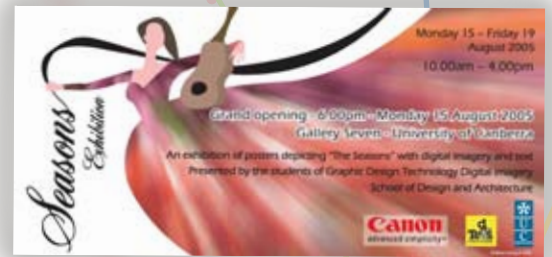
You can then choose a six-unit major in Community Development or Counselling Studies.

- **Community Development** is a growing profession for working with individuals, groups and communities for sustainable social change.
- **Counselling Studies** prepares students to use counselling skills when working with individuals and small groups for positive change.

You will also complete a four-unit minor in either Community Development or Counselling Studies, depending on your choice of major. You also choose a four-unit minor or four elective units—a good way to make sure you study what is of particular interest to you. (However, if you have relevant TAFE or other qualifications you may be exempt from some/all of these units.)

Two placements help you gain experience in the field. In second year, you spend 20 days observing and participating in one or two organisations chosen by you. In final year, you undertake a project of your choice that meets an agency's need. (You can do your placements at your workplace if relevant).
